## INTRODUCTION

Matlock Town Council are the owners of the land shown edged red on the plan ("the open space")

Transition Matlock have request the Town Council to permit them to take over and manage the open space as a Community Orchard and the Town Council have agreed to such request subject to these terms and conditions:

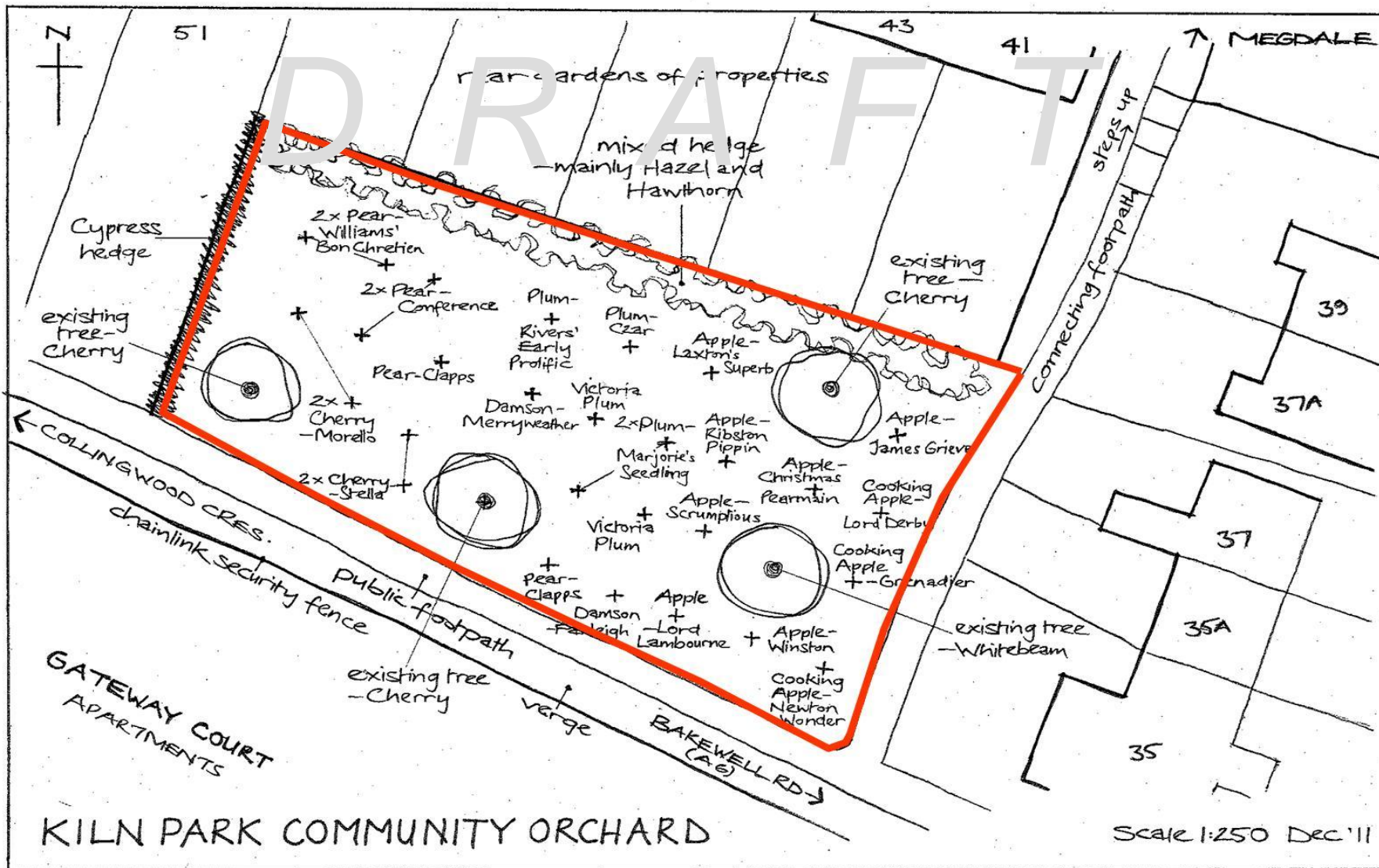
## TERMS

1. This agreement shall be effective from 1 February 2012 until 31 January 2016 inclusive subject to clause 3

2. Transition Matlock shall:
- a) pay to the Town Council a peppercorn rent of £1 forthwith.
  - b) pay all rates, taxes, assessments, compositions and outgoings which may be or become payable in respect of the open space over and above that which the Town Council already pays (mowing of the grass, removal of occasional detritis and general maintenance of the 3 amenity trees present on the site)
  - c) be responsible for maintaining the open space as outlined in the agreed Management Plan, allowing open access to the public at large when not required for Town Council purposes
  - d) not assign the benefit of the Agreement or underlet or part with the possession of the open space or any part of it
  - e) not permit any vehicle to use or enter upon the open space except such vehicles as may be necessary for the improvement and maintenance of the open space
  - f) not without the consent of the Town Council:
    - ~ carry out any landscaping works or excavations
    - ~ remove from the open space any soil, clay, sand or other materials
  - g) take out an appropriate Policy of Insurance in respect of Public Liability and indemnify the Town Council against all costs, claims, charges or demands which may arise as a result of the use of the open space and produce on demand the policy of insurance
  - h) carry out regular litter picks of the site
3. It is mutually agreed that should the Town Council require use of the open space for any purpose it shall give to Transition Matlock twelve months notice in writing to determine this agreement expiring at any time

## Denefields Volunteer Rangers Quarter 2 SLA July – Sept 2011



The Volunteer Ranger project aims to involve local residents in the management of Matlock's public green spaces. To improve sites for both biodiversity and public access.

### **Volunteer Ranger Activities**

During this quarter we have run 12 volunteer sessions on a Thursday morning. Volunteers have also helped set up and run a series of eco summer play schemes.

#### Tasks carried out at Denefields

- Weekly litter pick
- Weeding steps
- Ride and Glade creation in the woodland
- Spreading the old bales at bottom of site.
- Hedgerow maintenance
- Developing coppice area
- Wildflower seed collection
- Cutting back vegetation from paths and steps
- Made a bug box hotel
- Cut back blackthorn
- Removed Ash saplings and cut back brambles
- Wildflower Plug Planting

Over The last three months we have had between 4 - 12 volunteers out on site with an average of 6 regular adult volunteers. In addition to physical maintenance and improvements the Denefields Volunteers Rangers put up Marquees and set up trails etc for afternoon activities with local children.

### **Wild Thyme Community Garden**

The volunteers tidied borders and pathways, and undertook summer pruning on the later flowering shrubs. Some of the Ceanothus and New Zealand flax that died back after last winter's harsh conditions seem to be rejuvenating from the base. The Hebes and Cosmos we used to gap up such areas are flourishing.

### **Baileys Tump**

We have had one action morning at BaileysTump this quarter. Volunteers pulled all the ragwort off site, litter picked and removed ash saplings from the tree copse.

### **Chesterfield Rd Allotment**

We held one community action morning at Chesterfield Rd Allotment to tidy the wildlife garden, pond and pathways. We opened up 'The Bullaces' area and reduce some of the height of the shrubs to ensure neighbouring gardens were not over shadowed.



## **Community - Events**

### **Summer Holiday Eco- club**

During the summer holidays Groundwork Derby & Derbyshire and Matlock Town Council worked in partnership with Derbyshire Dales CVS to deliver a series of Eco- activities on Thursday afternoons. Caroline Stone from DDCVS supported families that use the Hurst Farm Community Centre to take part in the activities, the public were also invited along by means of posters and local advertising. Attendees were encouraged to book onto the activities, but when possible activities were opened up to passers by.



We had a great response and evaded the rains for three consecutive Eco activities.

### Meadow

This year the meadow was mowed and baled at the beginning of September. This was earlier than in previous years to ensure the cut happened before the grass bent over. We removed and have stored as much wildflower seed as possible to sow again next spring. The improved access enabled the team of contractors onto site with much more ease.



A local botanist has volunteered her time to survey the site and has now given the project an extensive and comprehensive list of the plants that make up the meadow area.

### Funding

We were unsuccessful with two applications during Q2; a North Face fund and an Arts Fund, we continue to seek funding for physical improvements, training for our volunteers and new tools.

**Revised Policy for the Management of Motorised Vehicles in the Countryside**

The County Council is revising its current Policy for managing motorised vehicles in the countryside. The revised Policy was presented to the Cabinet meeting on 1 November 2011 and Cabinet approved a period of public consultation which will end on 14 March 2012.

I attach a copy of the revised Policy for your consideration and comment. Also included is a survey form to enable you to respond with your Council's comments.
