At the Pic Tor War Memorial a service is held at 11.00 am

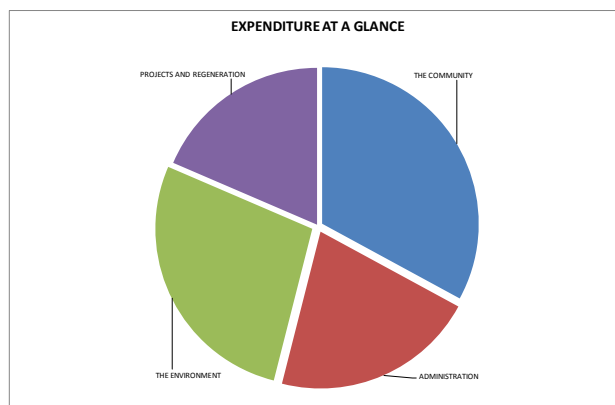
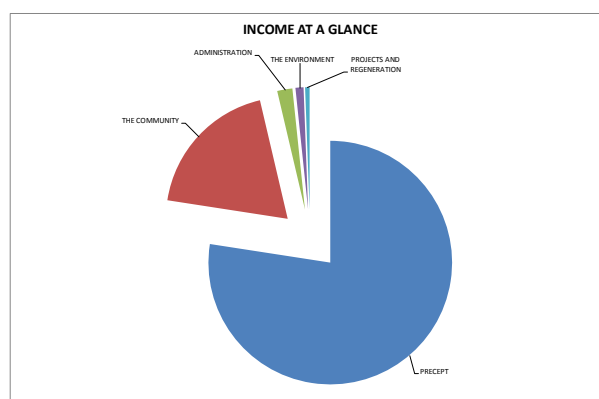
At the Starkholmes War Memorial a service is held at 11.20 am
